

Cairns is celebrated as the gateway to the Great Barrier Reef, Cape York and the Wet Tropics rainforest.

Its Tjapukai Aboriginal Cultural Park tells the stories of indigenous Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people with music and dance. Cairns Esplanade, lined with bars and restaurants, has a swimming lagoon. Northwest of the city, Daintree National Park spans mountainous rainforest, gorges and beaches.

Cairns was founded in 1876 and named after William Wellington Cairns, Governor of Queensland from 1875 to 1877. It was formed to serve miners heading for the Hodgkinson River goldfield, but declined when an easier route was discovered from Port Douglas. It later developed into a railhead and major port for exporting sugar cane, gold and other metals, minerals and agricultural products from surrounding coastal areas and the Atherton Tableland region.

Originally the primary source of income for the region was fishing but once gold was discovered in the north at Palmer River and Hodgkinson River, the population of Cairns grew and the European and Chinese settlers introduced agriculture to the region.

10 great things to do in and around Cairns

- 1. Take a walk through one man's dream at Paronella Park. Spanish migrant José Paronella's vision was to build a castle and, after many years of toil, the former cane cutter opened it to the public in 1935. More than 80 years later you can visit the heritage-listed property, with its crumbling castle, bridges, tunnel and 7500 tropical plants and trees set on 5ha beside a waterfall.
- Taste the tropics at Nu Nu beachfront restaurant on Palm Cove esplanade, where the day starts with a serve of coconut and banana hotcakes, topped with coconut sugar caramel. Head to Cape Trib Farm for a tasting tour of exotic fruits and make time to do one of the Atherton Tablelands' renowned food trails.
- 3. Encounter wildlife at Hartley's Crocodile Adventures, the Australian Butterfly Sanctuary, home to 2000 tropical butterflies, and Birdworld Kuranda and its 500 free-flying birds. At the new Cairns Aquarium, encounter marine creatures of all sizes, from sea cucumbers to sharks.
- 4. Wake up to a reef sunrise by booking a luxurious liveaboard dive trip. While you're out there, be sure to visit Lizard Island's famous Cod Hole to get a photo with one of the giant resident potato cod. Take a fast catamaran to Green Island, a glorious coral cay where you can swim in the warm waters, snorkel, dive or just relax on the white sandy beaches. An overnight glamping stay at Moore Reef Pontoon about 50km from Cairns with Sunlover Reef Cruises is a fascinating way to discover more of the reef's beauty.







- 5. Dine under chandeliers in the middle of the rainforest while two Aboriginal brothers share stories of their culture. The unique setting of Flames of the Forest ensures a magical, mystical experience.
- 6. Get your pulse racing at Flyboard Cairns, where a water-jet powered device propels you under water and into the air while strapped onto a kind of wakeboard. If white-water rafting is more your speed, there's nothing quite like tackling rapids under a rainforest canopy. Or soar above the rainforest on a jungle surfing adventure: a series of ziplines between six tree canopy platforms. And if you want a view of the reef from above, a tandem skydive could be just the answer.
- 7. Take a ride on the Skyrail Rainforest Cableway above tropical rainforest from Cairns to Kuranda. The 7.5km trip in six-person gondalas sweeps you above the forest canopy, with views to the reef. Or take a ride of a different kind on a horse along the beaches at Cape Tribulation, where the reef and rainforest meet.

- 3. Explore the lush beauty of Mossman Gorge, in the southern part of the Daintree Rainforest about 20 minutes from Port Douglas. Take a Dreamtime Walk with the local Kuku Yalanji people to be immersed in Indigenous culture, including a smoking ceremony.
- 9. Unleash your inner geologist at Undara, home to one of the best-preserved lava tube systems in the world, picnic beside a volcanic pipe at Mount Hypipamee National Park, swim in the Atherton Tablelands' volcanic crater lakes or navigate the caves at Chillagoe-Mungana Caves National Park.
- 10. Take a road trip on the Great Barrier Reef Drive from Cairns to Cape Tribulation, through the Daintree Rainforest. It's a great way to discover what lies north of Cairns, including its Northern Beaches – Palm Cove is a highlight – and the resort town of Port Douglas.



Popular Cairns Tours

KURANDA TOUR

Experience Tropical North Queensland - nature at its finest! Rail, gondolas, and amphibious Army Ducks all come together to enable you to appreciate the compelling enchantment of the rainforest. This tour



includes the rainforest village of Kuranda, Aboriginal dancing, a Dreamtime experience, and native animals. Witness the Pamagirri Aboriginal dancers perform in the rainforest amphitheatre. See native wildlife close-up - kangaroos, wombats, koalas and crocodiles. Ride the Skyrail Rainforest Cableway over pristine rainforest just metres above the forest canopy. Visit Rainforestation Nature Park set in a lush tropical environment. Visit the Australian Butterfly Sanctuary.

Army Duck Rainforest Tour

Experience the tropical rainforest from a totally unique perspective aboard an amphibious World War II Army Duck or DUKW (colloquially known as Duck). Rainforestation has twelve of these historical vehicles which hold up to 30 passengers and uses a 6-wheel drive, propeller and rudder. During this 45-minute rainforest tour, your knowledgeable Duck Captain will identify and explain fascinating plants and wildlife as you pass by before splashing into the lake for a cruise with more wildlife to be seen. During your tour, you'll visit the tropical fruit orchard which features over 60



different species of exotic tropical fruit trees and you'll learn about fruits of the region and the world. One of the most originally conceived vehicles in military history, the Army DUKW was produced as a

solution to a problem encountered in the early days of the Pacific conflict – time and again American supply vessels found themselves standing off shore from beleaguered forces with no way of landing vital supplies.



Skyrail Rainforest Cableway

Skyrail Rainforest Cableway journeys through the world's oldest continually surviving rainforest on earth, older than the Amazon Rainforest. Skyrail Rainforest Cableway is a 7.5 km scenic cableway running above the Barron Gorge National Park, in the Wet Tropics of Queensland's World Heritage Area. North of Cairns, it has won more than 25 awards. The cableway, which travels over the McAlister Range between <u>Smithfield</u> and <u>Kuranda</u>, includes six-person gondola cabins that travel metres above the treetops. A one-way trip takes

about 1.5 hours, and a return trip is about 2.5 hours. Two rainforest stations, Red Peak Station and <u>Barron Falls</u> Station, allow exploration of the forest floor on boardwalks, interaction with the environment and education of the World Heritage area.

Kuranda Scenic Railway

The Kuranda Scenic Railway is the name for the railway line that runs from Cairns, Queensland,

Australia, to the nearby town of <u>Kuranda</u>. The tourist railway snakes its way up the Macalister Range and is no longer used for regular commuter services, but instead operates as a travel and tourist service, operating every day of the year, except Christmas Day. It passes through the of Stratford, Freshwater (stopping suburbs at Freshwater Station) and Redlynch before reaching Kuranda. The line is used for some freight services and other passenger services, such as The <u>Savannah lander. The tropical gardens</u> Kuranda rail station are a well-known attraction in the area.



Downhill the line cuts through the <u>Barron Gorge National Park</u>. The tourist train stops at a lookout, with a sweeping view of <u>Barron Falls</u>. A number of smaller waterfalls are passed, including <u>Stoney Creek Falls</u>, just metres from the train. The station is a short walk into town where there is a zoo, markets, art galleries and ethnic Aboriginal crafts.

GREAT BARRIER REEF

The Great Barrier Reef, off the coast of Queensland in north-eastern Australia, is the largest living thing on Earth, and even visible from outer space. The 2,300km long ecosystem comprises thousands of reefs and hundreds of islands made of over 600 types of hard and soft coral. It's home to countless species of colourful fish, molluscs and starfish, plus turtles, dolphins and sharks.

Cairns Aquarium

The Cairns Aquarium has been developed to provide a world class venue for seeing and interacting with the incredible plants, animals, and habitats found only in Australia's Wet Tropics, a region which borders two World Heritage listed environments: The Daintree Rainforest and The Great Barrier Reef. As the only aquarium in the world dedicated exclusively to the habitats and species of tropical North Queensland, the Cairns Aquarium connects visitors with the natural wonders of The Great Barrier Reef, The Wet



Tropics, The Gulf Savannah and Cape York regions. With over 15,000 animals and unique opportunities to move up close to some of the world's most fascinating, elusive or deadly creatures, every visit is unforgettable. Tjapukai Aboriginal Cultural Park

Located in Cairns, Tropical North Queensland, Tjapukai has been sharing the authentic culture and traditions of the local Djabugay people for the past 28 years, providing employment opportunities for their people and giving the performers immense pride in demonstrating their culture. From its inception, Tjapukai's mission has been about giving Australians and international visitors the opportunity

experience authentic Aboriginal culture and interact with Traditional Owners. That mission now includes authentic Torres Strait Islander culture. Tjapukai was founded in Kuranda in 1987 by international theatre artists Don and Judy Freeman, David Hudson, a Ewamian man who was brought up among the Djabugay people, and his wife Cindy. They combined their performance expertise with the cultural knowledge of six Djabugay men – Willie Brim, Alby Baird, Wayne Nicols, Irwin Riley, Neville Hobbler and Dion Riley – to create a one-hour play incorporating the dance-rich culture of the Djabugay people who had lived in the rainforest around Kuranda for tens of thousands of years. In 1996 Tjapukai moved to a 25 acre site next to Skyrail Rainforest Cableway at Caravonica and expanded to include interactive cultural demonstrations and performances, a cultural village, restaurant and retail gallery. Tjapukai performers were in demand at world events as an authentic example of Australia's Indigenous culture. These included the Welcome Ceremony for the Sydney Olympic Torch and the bid for the Gold Coast to host the Commonwealth Games in 2018. In 2002 Queen Elizabeth and Prince Phillip's Australian visit included Tjapukai.

Daintree Wilderness

The Daintree National Park is an adventure playground for nature lovers. Book a guided tour to get the most out of the rain forest. Most tours set out from Cairns or Port Douglas and take in highlights such as the Mossman Gorge, Cape Tribulation, or Marrdja Boardwalk. The Daintree Rainforest and Cape Tribulation Rainforest are World Heritage listed due to the very unique biodiversity they hold and the rare and endangered animals, trees, and rainforest plants sustained here. The other unique connection of the Daintree Rainforest is to the



survival of the Great Barrier Reef and the continuance of drawing the rain to our region to ensure we have water all year round in Tropical North Queensland. When you take a guided Daintree Rainforest tour you can learn about the value of trees and plants to our health and the natural medicines they offer. Sit back relax and take home the knowledge of this land's natural biodiversity.

Cairns Lagoon

Entry to the Lagoon is free. Toilet and shower facilities are located in the amenities block alongside the Lagoon. Lifeguards are on duty while the Lagoon is open. Wheelchair access to the Lagoon is available. For assistance please ask the Lifeguards. The Lagoon is a 4800sq m salt water swimming facility that offers an all-year round, safe, swimming location without stingers and crocodiles. The Lagoon is filled with salt water from the Trinity Inlet which is filtered through a state-of-the-art filtration system.



Sample Itinerary for Cairns

Sample 1

Day 1

The best way to start any Cairns holiday is to arrive at the Airport which is just a 10 minute drive to the centre of Cairns City - gateway to the Great Barrier Reef.

Day 2

The first full day of your Cairns holiday will take you to the world heritage Great Barrier Reef - Reef Magic's Marine World is a purpose-built two storey platform featuring spacious lower deck with ample undercover seating, upper sundeck with sun lounges, underwater observatory, children's safety swimming enclosure, easy access to the water for snorkelers, moon pool for ease of access for divers and fresh water showers. Return to your Cairns accommodation late afternoon.

Day 3

Holidays in North Queensland would not be complete without a visit to famous Port Douglas located just one hour north of Cairns along the scenic Captain Cook Highway, a winding road with spectacular views of the Coral Sea. Spend the day enjoying the many shops and galleries in Port Douglas, you will find indigenous artwork and crafts alongside designer labels, whatever you are looking for you are sure to find just the thing!

Day 4

Take a day trip to magnificent Cape Tribulation and the <u>Daintree</u> Rainforest for day four of your Cairns holiday. Time to head home; as you depart the beautiful tropical north you can look forward to planning future Cairns holidays or to perhaps the <u>Whitsundays</u> or one of the Queensland Islands such as Daydream or Hamilton Islands.

From kicking off the day with a beachside yoga sesh, to getting salty with a morning surf followed by a caffeine-fix, heading for the hills to cool off in crystal-like cascades, and perusing new menus in alfresco-style eateries, it's safe to say there's quite a bit going on in this coastal city. From hitting the hills with a picnic packed and Google maps set to 'waterfall', to salty days spent running barefoot in the sand, indulging with a spot of shopping, or feasting alfresco-style in truly superb settings, the Gold Coast's unique beach-meets-bush backyard will ensure your itinerary is overflowing with one-of-a-kind adventures. *Here are 10 of the best.*

1. Get Salty With sand the colour of sugar, water temps that rarely dip under 20 degrees and a soundtrack set on 'endless ocean', it's safe to say the Gold Coast is a blissful, beachside nirvana. Head to tranquil inlets like the Broadwater or Tallebudgera Creek for a family-friendly beach day. From ripping barrels at Snapper Rocks to right-hander wonders at Currumbin Alley and point break pearlers at Burleigh, surfers are spoilt for choice when hitting the waves here. The Gold Coast's surf schools boast qualified instructors, surf lifesavers and soft foam longboards to ensure you're up and riding waves by the end of your first lesson.



- 2. Experience ancient rainforests Ribbon-like roads reel you through a canvas of verdant hills that lead to spectacular waterfalls. Indulge in quaint local fudge shops and discerning distilleries, and pick up sweet local produce at fruit stalls along the way. Stand hundreds of metres above sea level and drink in the infinite views that stretch across an ancient realm. Wander through World-Heritage listed rainforests, follow walking tracks that weave through a subtropical dreamland, and cool off with a well-deserved dip beneath a magnificent cascade. The Springbrook and Lamington National Parks tucked away in the Gold Coast hinterland seem like a different world compared with the beachside city, which is still just a stone's throw away.
- 3. Foodies rejoice The Coast is a place where night bites, hatted restaurants, street-eats and breweries are all served with a side of alfresco. Join the surfers as they swap their boards for a latte at sun-up and the little ones as they break from frolicking for an epic spread of fish and chips beachside. Dust the sand from your feet for five-star feasting on fresh seafood at The Fish House or enjoy pan-Asian flavours with an ocean view at Rick

Shores in Burleigh. Fuel up from five different kitchens under one sun-soaked rooftop bar at The

Collective in Palm Beach. Come sunset, gather friends for decadent share plates and expert cocktails throughout Broadbeach at the likes of Social Eating House, Cherry at The Star Gold Coast and newcomers Old Tom and Roosevelt. There's a wave of new culinary experiences coming to life throughout the Gold Coast. From tap-houses owned by surfing heroes to reinvented, artistic venues - you're in for a treat when it comes to dining and relaxing on the Gold Coast.

4. Make a splash Chase the waves at first light, take the family out for an afternoon stand up paddle board session or take a sunset spin in the tinny on the Broadwater. Dip your toes in the Northern Gold Coast's beautiful Broadwater, or better yet, hire a



boat and sail into the sunset with a glass of bubbles in hand. Grab a stand up paddleboard or kayak and explore the serene shoreline and calm canals that weave their way through the city (it's seriously fun AND good for the abs). Adrenaline junkies – you'll find your fix here too, with jet skiing, jet packing and flyboarding all on the cards at Main Beach.

5. On your bike Get on your bike for a two-wheeled exploration of a city made for cyclists. More than 1000km of bikeways link the Gold Coast's neighbourhoods, foreshores and parks. Hire a cruiser bike and cover some serious ground on the beach road

- stretching from Main Beach to Burleigh Heads. Mountain-bikers are well catered for too, at Coombabah Lakelands Conservation Area at the city's northern end, which features more than 1200ha of wetland, eucalypt forest, salt marsh and mangrove habitat. For the more adventurous, head to Nerang for some serious trailblazing in the hills.
- 6. Calling all culture vultures There's a new kind of wave in town, one splashed in colour and creativity, sewn with strings of a different sound, bubbling with vision, passion and a sprinkle of tradition. The Coast's cultural current is carving out more street cred than ever before; teeming with talent, creative minds and entrepreneurial souls, the city's spirit beats to the sound of its own drum. Buzzing festivals and performing arts, live music jams and contemporary art can be seen any day of the week. Beneath the new lies an ancient heartbeat; the Coast's indigenous roots run deep. Learn about the Kombumberri and Yugambeh culture at Jellurgal Cultural Centre with tours, Dreamtime stories and colourful Corroborees all dotted with magic and meaning.
- 7. Spoil your tastebuds Local wares from the soil and the soul. The Gold Coast is a community of passionate foodies and creators from the farmer trading his home-grown harvest at the village market, to the salt-seasoned hands of a trawler hauling in this morning's catch. Streets, parks and markets double as foodie playgrounds where fresh is celebrated, quality local wares are traded barefoot and live acoustic tunes hang in the air. Peruse locally hand-made artisan wares and jewels at weekend market stalls; or wander charming beachside villages brimming with boutiques that carry the latest threads from our bevvy of talented local designers.
- 8. Strap yourself in for some theme park thrills. Theme parks rise from the sand and sea with cute, cuddly and roaring wildlife encounters; rides built for those who want to fly, and cafés and snack bars serving up sticky treats alongside gourmet eats. Shake hands with your favourite superhero, cuddle а loveable cartoon character, or take a behind-thescenes peak at all that Warner Bros. Movie World magic. Snap a selfie with adorable Aussie animal Dreamworld's Corroboree, or meet one of Sea World's resident pelicans at the Seabird Rehabilitation Aviary. Snack on fairy floss the size of your head, then try your darndest to keep



it down with a back-to-back rollercoaster ride (it is a theme park rite of passage after all). Slip, slide and splash about at Wet'N'Wild or White Water World, where tan lines and wrinkly fingers are all part of the fun.

- 9. Take to the air Get up early and watch the sun rise over the sea from a hot-air balloon. Cruising above the hinterland at 600m, you can see all the way from Tamborine Mountain in the north to Lamington National Park in the south, and beyond. Prefer something with wings? Board a scenic flight for a birds-eye view over the beaches. Or perhaps a helicopter tour that allows you to dip even closer to the buildings and waves? And if, after all that, you fancy the idea of flying unaided, you can try your hand at indoor skydiving in the centre of Surfers Paradise. Or try your skills at the country's highest, tallest and fastest Treetop Challenge at Tamborine Mountain in the Gold Coast Hinterland.
- 10. Meet the locals Meet the locals and we don't just mean the human kind. Start out at Paradise Country, to experience farm life first hand (there is an option to stay here, too). Watch sheep shearers at work, admire how stockmen and their dogs round up their flocks and enjoy a whip-cracking display. At Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary, feed a massive saltwater crocodile or, if that's not to your liking, wild rainbow lorikeets. Walk a wombat, get a selfie with a koala, echidna or

dingo, and get a close-up look at the sanctuary's Tasmanian devils. And for a chance to see what lives beneath the Pacific Ocean waves, dive or snorkel with sea turtles, eagle rays, (harmless) sharks and even the occasional clownfish, aka Nemo on tours run by Watersports Guru, just a 15-minute boat trip off the coast. You might spot a dolphin without getting wet from Point Danger at Coolangatta or on the Burleigh National Park Rainforest Walk. Learn more about the work of David Fleay, Australia's Father of Conservation, at the David Fleay Wildlife Park in West Burleigh.
